The Centre for the Rule of Law and European Values - Objectives

(i) explore the state of the rule of law, using empirical research

(ii) investigate the deterioration of the rule of law and EU

(iii) evaluate the mechanisms available at the EU level to secure European values and rule of law protections; and

(iv) deliver research-informed teaching







CRoLEV General Research Objectives

- Determining the state of the rule of law and other European values and principles in turbulent times
- Evaluate how public responses to crises (e.g., COVID-19) have affected the rule of law
- Explore the effectiveness of European mechanisms designed to safeguard the rule of law and European values
- State of the rule of law in Cyprus?







CRoLEV Specific Research Objectives

- Threats to the rule of law and other European values across Europe (and beyond)
 - Responses to COVID-19 and rule of law
 - Populism and the rule of law
- Evaluating EU responses
 - Ineffectiveness of existing mechanisms (Art.7 TEU)
 - Turn to new mechanisms (Conditionality Regulation)







CRoLEV Specific Research Objectives

- Rule of law in Cyprus
 - Corruption and existing public institutions
 - Existing data on Cyprus show the inefficiency of the justice system
 - E-justice
 - But much of existing data on Cyprus are insufficient (do not track all elements that we consider relevant to the rule of law)
 - Supplement that through empirical research looking at different aspects of the rule of law in Cyprus







CRoLEV Specific Research Objectives

- Propose innovative ways to approach questions related to the rule of law:
 - Broadened conceptions of the rule of law
 - Emphasis on elements often disregarded when discussing the rule of law (e.g., public trust in institutions, attitudes of insiders)
 - Make recommendations that could result in the better safeguarding of the rule of law and European Values
