This 10-hour course looks at rights and values related to technologies development, deployment and use with special focus on artificial intelligence. In order to achieve this aim, it seeks to familiarise students with key concepts, practices and regulative frameworks. In the final part of the course, an informal assessment exercise will take place where students can show their learning. The course will cover the following themes:

- Al impact on human rights

This course is relevant for any advanced student or professional interested in technologies impact and digital age implications for people and societies including on the rule of law, human rights and democracy.
