All submissions will undergo a double peer-reviewed process under the supervision of the CRoLEV Editorial Board. Submissions

The Yearbook RoLEV is an output that seeks to contribute to ongoing debates about the state of the rule of law, democracy, and other European values across the EU. We therefore invite contributions from researchers working in different disciplines that study and investigate such themes. CRoLEV has already undertaken work in analysing specific aspects of the rule of law. In particular, we have identified specific pillars that relate to the rule of law and which, in our view, warrant further exploration, which you can view here.

We therefore invite submissions that relate to themes included in those pillars, such as, but not limited to:

Civic engagement, the relationship between rule of law protections and grass-roots political

• participation, structures of democracy, political participation, and/or citizen empowerment, both from empirical and theoretical perspectives;

Democratic governance and the relationship between rule of law and democracy, including

• institution and non-institutional means of safeguarding the rule of law in a democratic state (anti-corruption, transparency, access to information, free press), both from empirical and theoretical perspectives.

Submissions should take the form of original research in the form of a scientific article (8000-10000 words). The deadline for the submission of a complete manuscript is the 21st of March 2025. Selected submissions will be notified by April 2025. All submissions will then undergo double blind review.
